The 1825 Crimes Act

This act provides all prior legislation that otherwise was not repealed. That includes the 1790 Crimes Act, the piracy Act of 1819, and the Piracy Act of 1820, and the entire act of the Bank Act of 1816.

Because there were no federal prisons, all sentencings took place at State Level prisons.
